



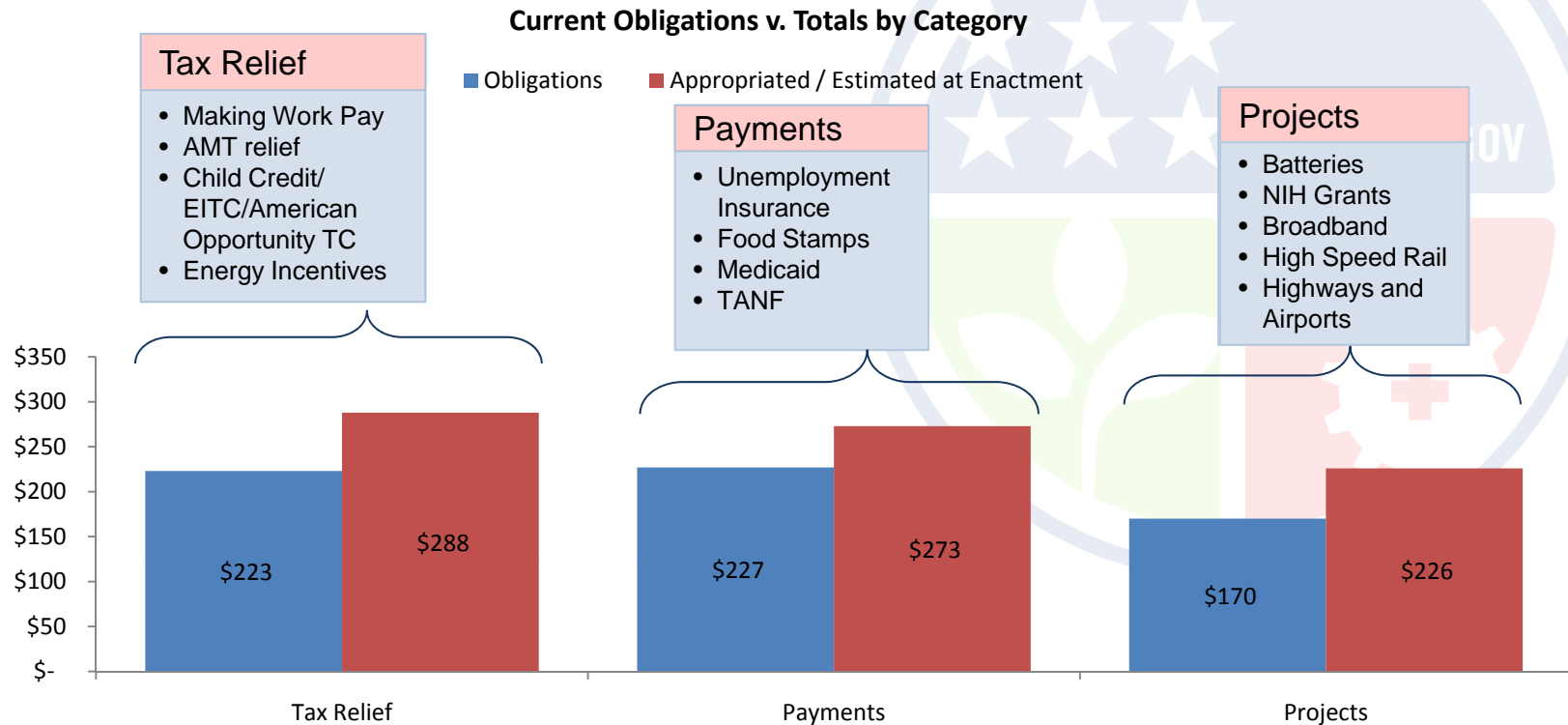

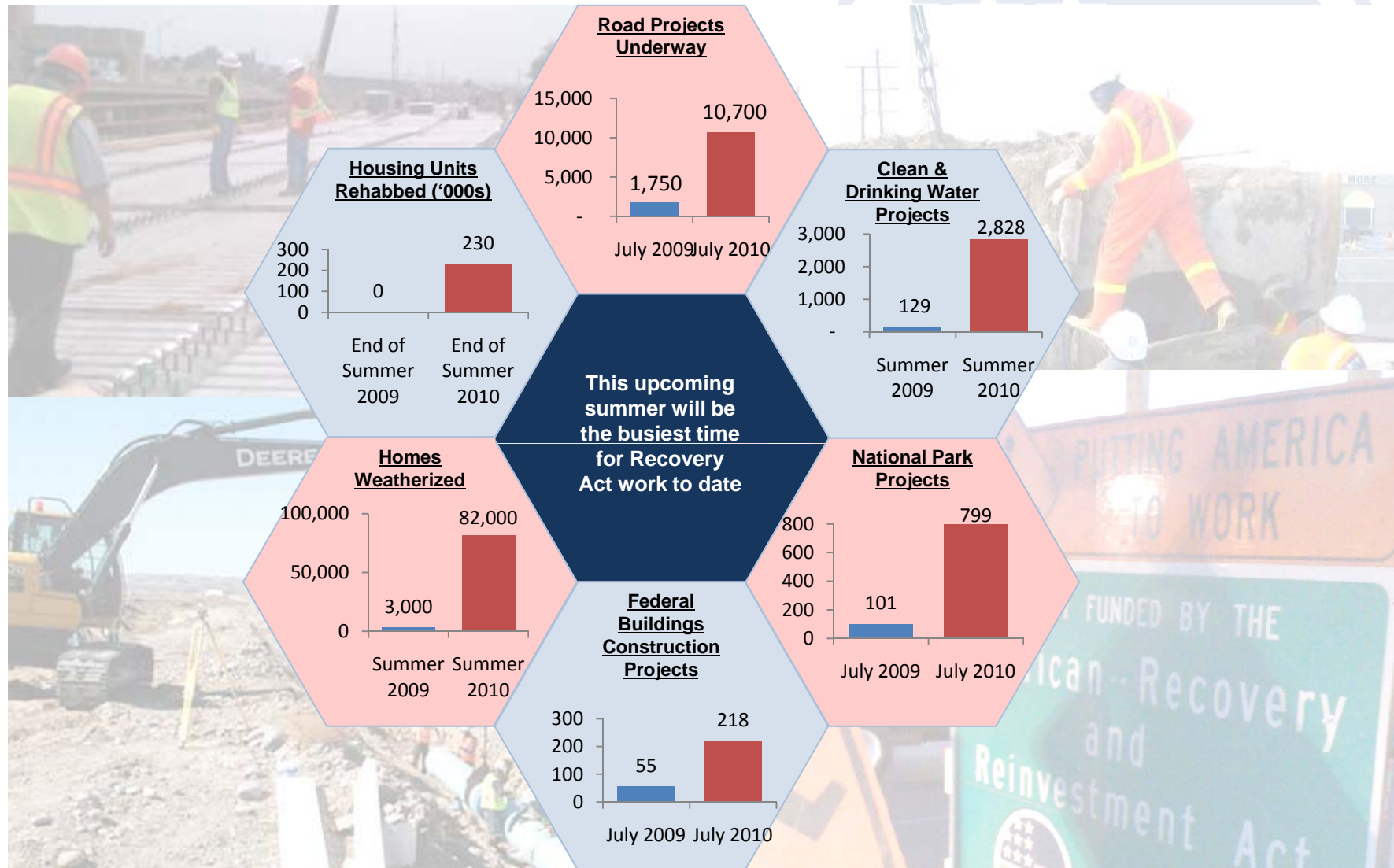
The Recovery Act has already put over \$620 billion to work; many programs are ahead of schedule



Job Creation

- Recipients reported **over 680,000 jobs** funded with ARRA dollars in the Jan. 1, 2010 – March 30, 2010 period – a total that reflects the use of less than one fifth of Recovery Act funds
- CEA estimates that **2.2 to 2.8 million jobs** have been created or retained as of the first quarter of CY 2010
- CBO reported that ARRA increased the number of people employed by between **1.2 million and 2.8 million** in the first quarter of CY 2010

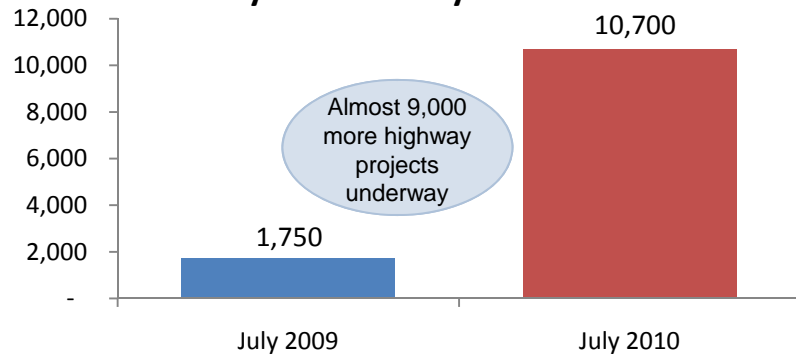
We are entering “Recovery Summer” and will see the highest levels of Recovery Act PROJECT activity yet



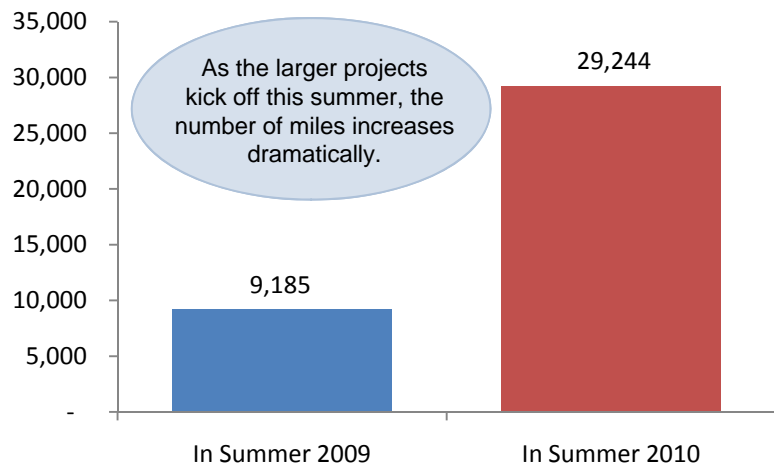
Recovery Roads: Transportation projects in summer 2010 will be up sharply from summer 2009

Across the country, more highway projects will be underway with more work being accomplished

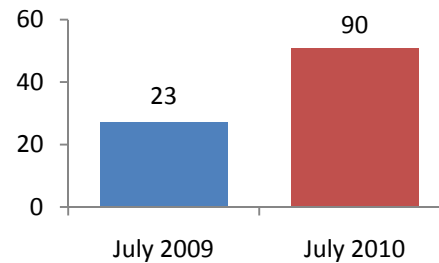
Highway Projects Underway July 2009 vs. July 2010



Miles of Highway Improved

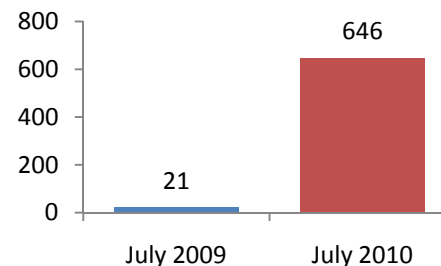


Colorado highway projects will see a significant increase



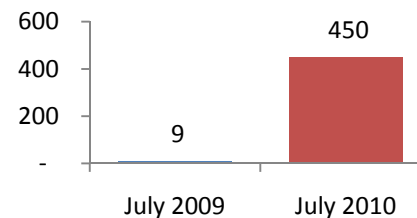
Colorado workers have already billed more than three quarters of a million hours, and expect much more this summer.

Michigan highway and bridge activity will ramp up



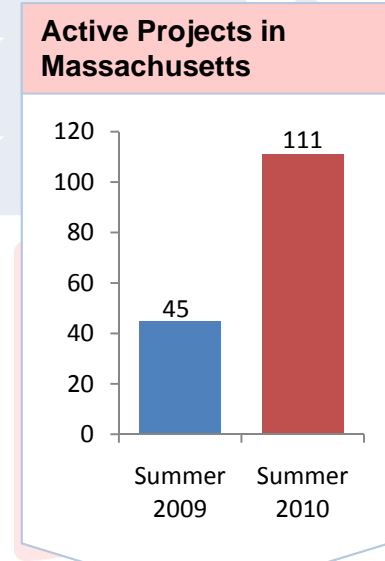
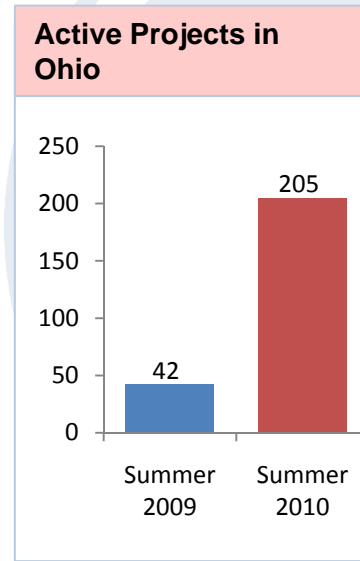
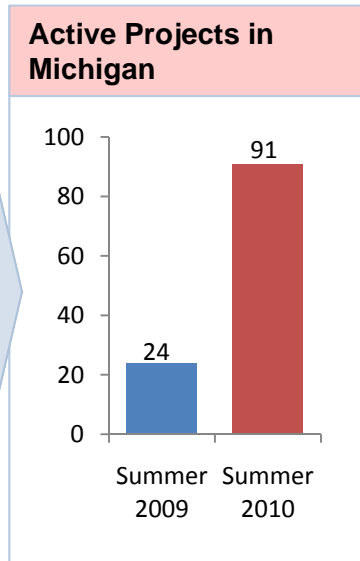
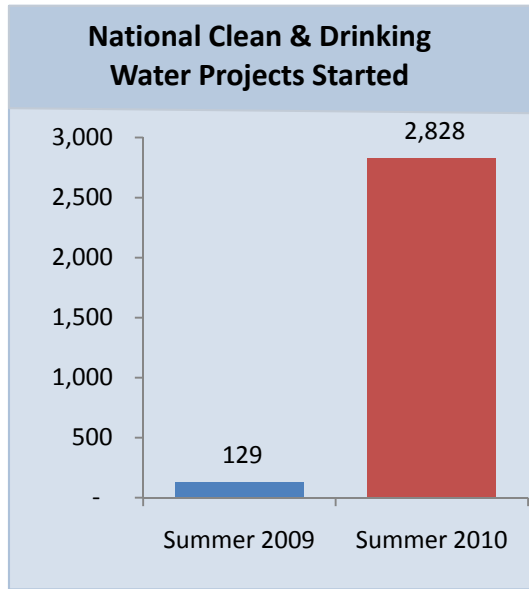
This summer, people will be working on highway projects in every county in Michigan.

Water Pollution Control Facility Upgrade in Fairhaven, MA

The problem:

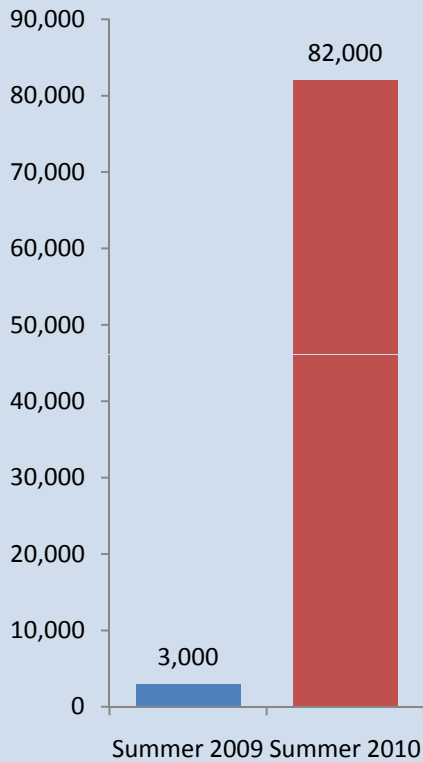
Creating expense and inconvenience, the town of Fairhaven, MA, currently has to truck sewer waste from its water pollution facility to an off-site location in Rhode Island.

The solution:

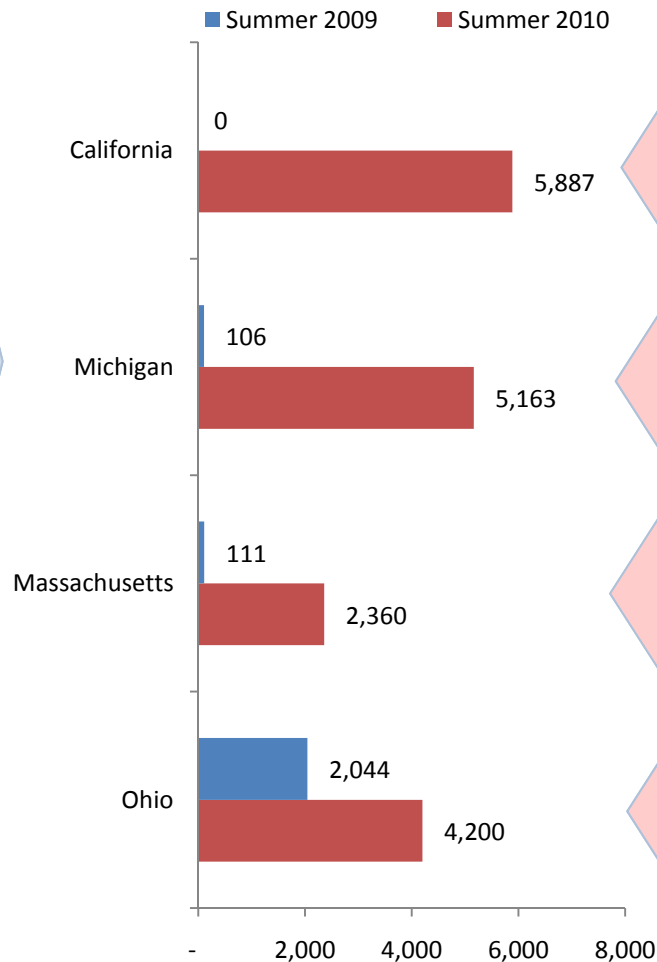
Using a \$7.9 M Recovery Act award, Fairhaven has hired WES Construction to install an anaerobic digestion and cogeneration system to convert waste into methane gas, which it will then use for power generation. The project will save the town \$260,000 per year in energy costs and create 30 local jobs.

... and weatherization, now at its targeted implementation pace, will see huge strides made this summer

The number of homes weatherized this summer with Recovery Act funds will be a drastic increase over last summer...



...as evidenced by what will be seen in states across the country.



One California weatherization program is pairing foster youth with the hired sub-contractors, for an opportunity to be hired permanently after the program.

On any given workday, construction on homes will be happening in every region of the state.

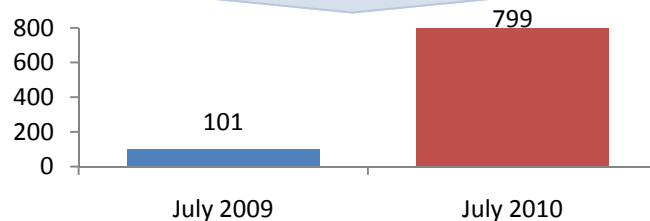
Over 100 weatherization contractors are providing weatherization services in literally every corner of the Commonwealth with ARRA funds.

At least one home is being weatherized in every single one of Ohio's 88 counties.

The Recovery Act Funds Construction at Ellis Island

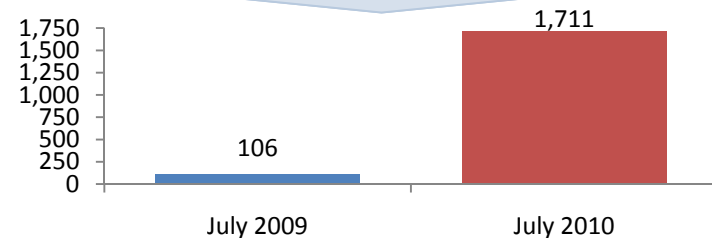
Problem: Built before 1934, portions of the seawall that protects Ellis Island are seriously deteriorated, creating safety risks for the 3.7 million annual visitors to the site.

Solution: With a \$33 million National Parks Service Recovery Act grant, over 6,700 feet of seawall will be stabilized; power and communications infrastructure will be enhanced; and hazardous materials will be removed from the island.



Public Lands

Including National Parks, Public Lands projects have **increased over 16 times** since last summer...



Public Lands Projects in New Mexico

Like many states across the country, New Mexico is seeing heavy investment of Recovery Act funds into public lands. \$40 million will fund 71 projects across the state, including:

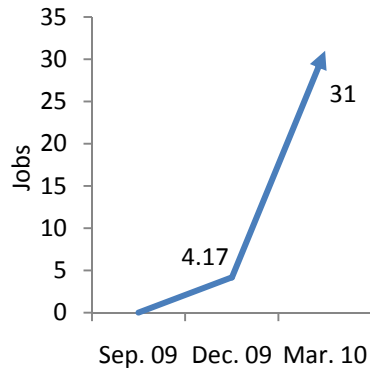
- 2 construction projects;
- 12 habitat restoration projects;
- 4 renewable energy authorization projects;
- 4 road maintenance projects;
- 5 trail projects; and
- 44 deferred maintenance projects.

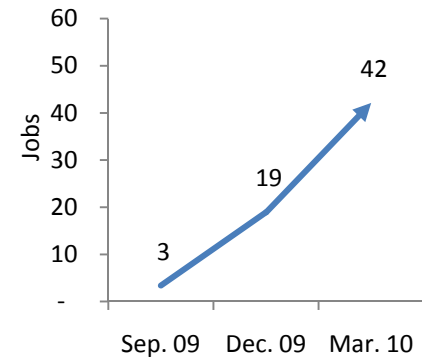
Premier Data Services Inc.

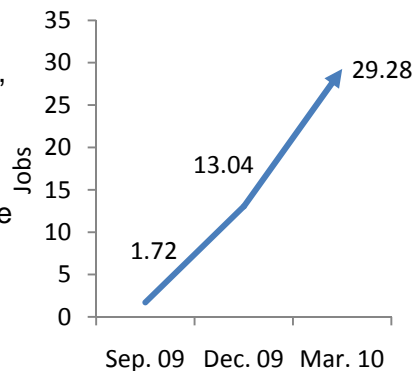
Shiel Sexton Company, Inc.

Indianapolis, IN: Shiel Sexton Company, Inc. received a construction contract from the General Services Administration for the renovation and modernization of a Federal courthouse



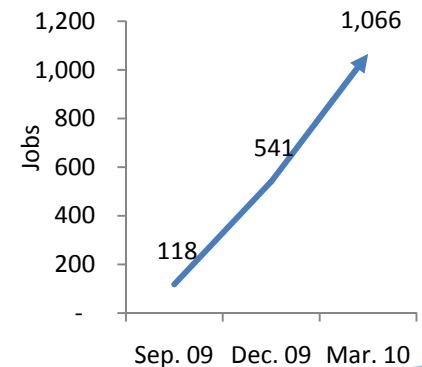
Nicholson & Galloway, Inc.

Brooklyn, NY: Nicholson & Galloway, Inc. received a construction contract from GSA to make repairs and replace the roof on the Brooklyn Post Office.

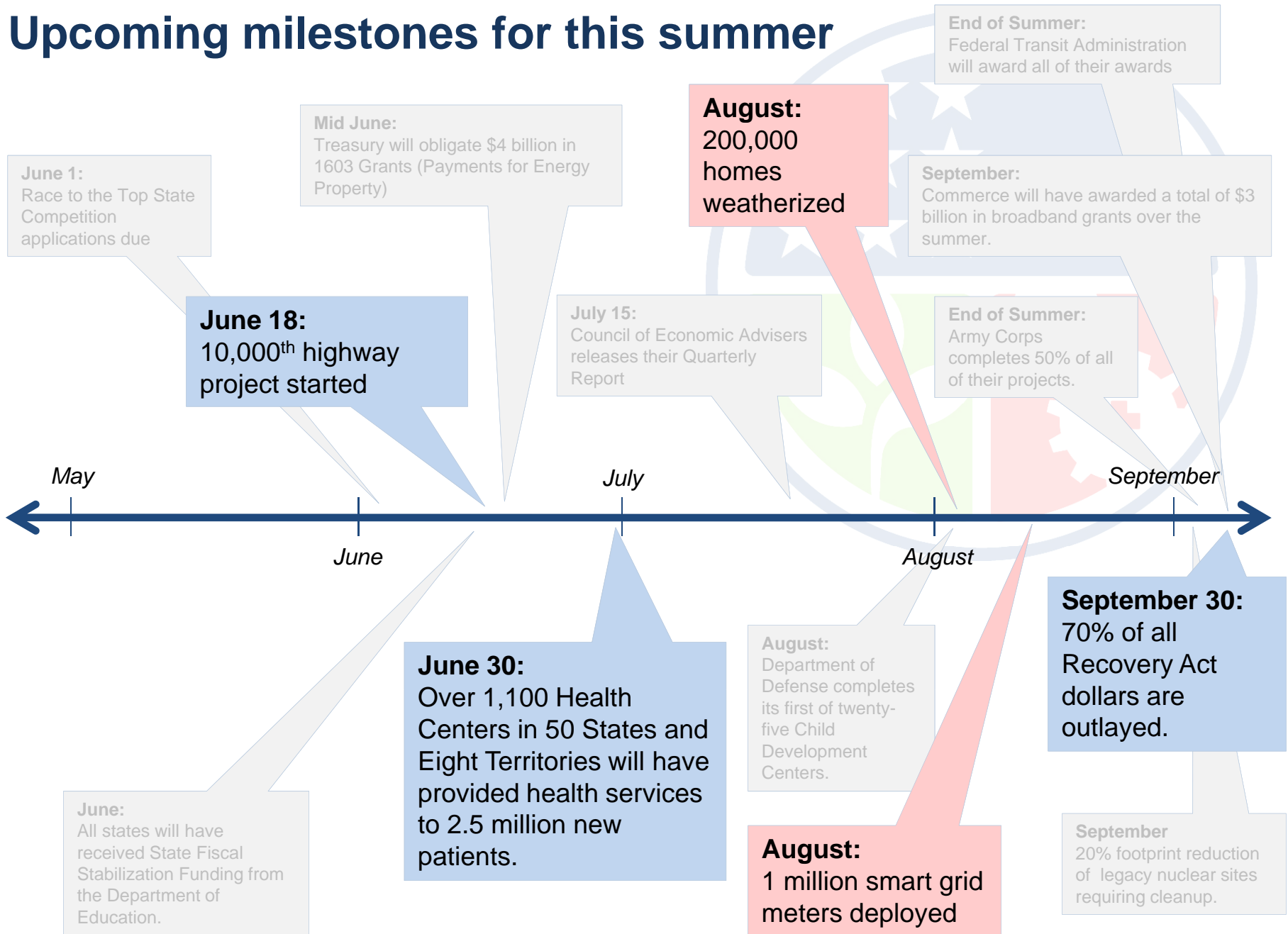


Solyndra, Inc.
