[1] Estimates assume the same formula allocation for each state as in 2012. Since states may gain or lose funding each year depending on future changes in economic conditions, these estimates do not reflect precisely what would happen in 2013 and 2014. The projected decrease in participants for each state was derived by applying the percentage reduction in funding for each state to the national projected reduction in the number of participants served.
