Statement from OMB Director Shaun Donovan:

**Budgetary Impact Analysis for Executive Order Entitled
“Promoting Private Sector Cybersecurity Information Sharing”**

This executive order encourages the creation of Information Sharing and Analysis Organizations by the private sector and encourages sharing of cybersecurity information between the private sector and the government. Implementing this executive order is anticipated to increase costs and have no impact on revenues to the Federal Government. The benefits of the executive order include improving cybersecurity information sharing. Implementing this executive order is anticipated to increase discretionary obligations and outlays for this purpose in 2015, but is not anticipated to increase discretionary obligations overall. Implementing this executive order is anticipated to have no impact on mandatory obligations or revenues to the Federal Government, in the 5-fiscal year period beginning in fiscal year 2015. The agencies anticipated to be impacted by this executive order are the Departments of Justice, Defense, Homeland Security, and Commerce, the Office of the Director of National Intelligence, and the Executive Office of the President.
