Dear Mr. Chairman:

I am transmitting an update on the use of the Emergency Response Fund (ERF) appropriations. This report covers the use of the \$40 billion provided by P.L. 107-38, the FY 2001 Emergency Supplemental Appropriations Act for Recovery from and Response to Terrorist Attacks on the United States, and P.L. 107-117, the FY 2002 Department of Defense and Emergency Supplemental Appropriations for Recovery from and Response to Terrorist Attacks on the United States. As of the end of May, the Executive Branch agencies have reported cumulative obligations of \$38.6 billion. This leaves \$235 million in unobligated balances.

*The Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service has approximately \$0.6 million in unobligated balances remaining in the Salaries and Expenses account. The remaining funds are being used to award funding to State cooperators for emergency response (\$0.2 million) and Animal Health Monitoring (\$0.3 million) activities, and to continue to fund a variety of activities begun with the Homeland Security supplemental (\$0.1 million).

**The Agricultural Research Service has approximately \$2.2 million in unobligated balances remaining in the Salaries and Expenses account. The remaining research funds (\$2.2 million) have been allocated and continue to be obligated for the development and validation of assays targeting rapid detection of high consequence animal and plant pathogens.

***The Food Safety and Inspection Service has approximately \$0.4 million in unobligated balances. The remaining funds are being used to continue the operation of the Consumer Complaint Monitoring System which tracks food-related consumer complaints (\$0.2 million), continue to provide technical assistance to States (\$0.1 million) and continue education and training activities designed to improve FSIS' detection and emergency response capabilities (\$0.1 million).

****Of the funds appropriated to the Office of the Secretary, approximately \$1.5 million remains in unobligated balances. Within this total, \$1.1 million remains in the allocation to Departmental Administration and will be used for physical/operational security needs, \$0.2 million remains in the allocation to the Office of the Chief Information Officer and will be used to complete the Business Resumption and Disaster Recovery Plans for critical information systems and complete the Project Matrix review that is to be conducted by the Department of Homeland Security, and \$0.2 million remains in the allocation to the Homeland Security Staff to cover salary and benefit costs. Approximately, \$0.15 million of the Homeland Security Staff funds will be directed toward the creation of an Agriculture Security Checklist to be distributed to our farm and ranch constituency. The funds should be obligated by early August. The reduction in obligations from the March 2005 report was due to a deobligation of funds for security enhancements to Forest Service facilities that were completed under cost. The deobligated funds will be used to fund ongoing homeland security projects.

***OS Unobligated Funds: will be used for the Emergency Operation Contingency Fund, which are used to respond to emergency activations that are not authorized under the Stafford Act. The remaining funds will be used for technological upgrades to the Secretary's Command Center and continuing operation; along with completion of the HHS alternative COOP site in Raleigh, NC; and for use in the Stockpile fund. Funds were originally placed in an interagency agreement to Centers for Disease Control and Prevention funds for support to the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO) in order to enhance early detection, identification, and reporting of infectious disease outbreaks associated with potential bioterrorism-related or naturally occurring infectious organisms. •\$4.294 million remaining for the computer intrusion program. The Congress has approved a spending plan for these funds, and they will be obligated by the end of FY 2005.

•\$2.8 million is spread throughout the other initiatives. This includes \$0.686 remaining for Computer Analysis Response Team (CART), and \$1.396 for Combined Index DNA Systems. These remaining funds will be obligated by the end of FY 2005.
