Statement from OMB Director Shaun Donovan:

**Budgetary Impact Analysis for Executive Order Entitled
“Amending Executive Order 13675 to
Expand Membership on the President’s Advisory Council
on Doing Business in Africa”**

This executive order would increase membership on the President’s Advisory Council on Doing Business in Africa from 15 to up to 26 private sector corporate members. Implementing this executive order would have a de minimis impact on costs and revenues to the Federal Government. The benefits of the executive order include enabling the Advisory Council as a whole to better reflect the diversity of sectors, geographies, and company sizes of the U.S. business community doing business in Africa, resulting in impactful, consensus advice to further expand commercial engagement between the United States and Sub-Saharan Africa. Implementing this executive order would have a de minimis impact on mandatory and discretionary obligations and outlays, as well as on revenues to the Federal Government, in the 5-fiscal year period beginning in fiscal year 2016. Agencies anticipated to be impacted by this Executive Order include the Department of Commerce.
