Statement from OMB Director Shaun Donovan:

**Budgetary Impact Analysis for Executive Order Entitled
“Amending Executive Order 13467 to Establish the
Roles and Responsibilities of the National Background Investigations Bureau
And Related Matters”**

The proposed order would amend Executive Order 13467. This executive order would increase costs and have no impact on revenues to the Federal Government. The benefits of this executive order include incorporating the newly-created National Background Investigations Bureau (NBIB) in the existing governance structure for the Federal government’s background investigation processes, and codifying the Department of Defense’s responsibility for developing and operating NBIB’s information technology systems. Implementing this executive order would have no impact on mandatory and would increase discretionary obligations and outlays, and have no impact on revenues to the Federal Government, in the 5-fiscal year period beginning in fiscal year 2017. Agencies anticipated to be impacted by this executive order include the Department of Defense, Office of Personnel Management, Office of the Director of National Intelligence, and all executive departments and agencies whose federal and contractor employees are required to undergo a background investigation and are subject to the requirements of Executive Order 13467.
