Statement from OMB Director Shaun Donovan:

**Budgetary Impact Analysis for Executive Order Entitled
“Termination of Emergency with Respect to the
Actions and Policies of the Government of Burma”**

This executive order would terminate the national emergency declared in Executive Order 13047 regarding the actions and policies of the Government of Burma. Implementing this executive order would have a de minimis impact on costs and revenues to the Federal Government. The benefits of the executive order include furthering the United States’ overall sanctions policy by avoiding the unnecessary use of national emergency authorities and supporting the new democratically elected and civilian-led Government of Burma’s efforts to promote economic growth and prosperity. Implementing this executive order would have a de minimis impact on mandatory and discretionary obligations and outlays, as well as on revenues to the Federal Government in the five-fiscal-year period beginning in fiscal year 2017. Agencies anticipated to be impacted by this Executive Order include the Departments of State and the Treasury.
