
## Hancock County Underage Drinking Problem Identification

2012 Data Showed a concerning amount of underage drinking taking place in our community.

- 1. Minor consumption arrests (18-20 yr. olds) was 43.
- 2. NASA community survey showed 62.4% of people knew of youth who drink.
- 3. The IPRC Survey of our youth showed the results in the table shown.



## Problem Identification

In addition to the data, reports of underage drinking parties were present in our community.

- A principal approached our organization with concerns surrounding underage drinking parties taking place.
   Other schools were seeing the same thing.
  - PROBLEM: Information was after the fact.
- A meeting with the Sheriff and Major Burkhart confirmed that law enforcement believed underage drinking was an issue as well and began the discussion on what we could do as a community to address the problem.

# Creating a Community Partnership

After the identification of the problem, our coalition began a planning phase that would facilitate the beginning of the Hancock County Underage Drinking Task Force.

## TASK FORCE GOALS

- 1. To reduce Underage Drinking in Hancock County
- 2. To provide consistent enforcement of underage drinking laws county wide.
- 3. To support on-duty officers with Task Force members to aide in the arrest, transport, and processing of individuals violating underage drinking laws.


# Hancock County Underage Drinking Task Force Agreement

#### Key Components:

- Defines "Party"
- 2. Zero Tolerance
- Removes officer discretion by implementing department policy
- 4. Sets team guidelines and lead officer on scene
- 5. Gets on-duty officers back on the roads, but allows for the underage drinking violations to be addressed consistently
- 6. Judges have set a \$200 cash bond for all "C" misdemeanors (includes Minor Consumption)
- 7. Schools working to add best practices from other schools in the county
- 8. Juvenile Probation agreement for consistent penalties


## Community Results
