

Community Problem

Manufacture, Sale and Use of Methamphetamine

Pseudoephedrine is the precursor for the manufacturing of methamphetamine. You can not make "Meth" without pseudoephedrine. Pseudoephedrine sales are a direct link to meth lab production which in return affects all aspects of our community especially our children.



Pseudoephedrine sales from local pharmacies (SMURFING) has been continually increasing over the past three years.

- Over the past three years we have seen an increase in the number of children being taken into state custody who test positive for methamphetamine. 35% of all children removed from meth homes test positive for methamphetamine.
- The county has seen a significant increase in the number of Meth lab seizures.

Community Snapshot

Local Conditions are conducive to the manufacture of methamphetamine

- ➤ Citizens have easy access to pseudoephedrine through local pharmacies.
- > Due to the nature of our rural community it is easy to make meth and dispose of the waste in the surrounding farmlands.
- ➤ The ingredients to make a batch of meth is cheap. A meth cook can cook a batch of meth for approx. \$25 and sell the product for over \$200.00 a \$175 profit!
- Due to the number of citizens in treatment and recovery from our community there is a high demand for meth. The shake and bake method is quick and easy to make.
- ➤ Meth is inexpensive to buy and there is a high profit margin.
- ➤ There is a high demand for methamphetamine.
- ➤ Pseudoephedrine is easily accessible.

In order to increase community awareness of the **METH** epidemic, the coalition partnered with local and state organizations to conduct a town hall meeting. Over 500 citizens attended the first meeting in 2010.













Modify/change policy

Local city ordinances were passed to require pseudoephedrine products to be sold only by prescription only.





State Level -Outcomes

The coalition worked diligently with our local representative and state legislators for the following state bills to be passed.

Bills Passed during 2014 Legislative Session

- •SB1312 / HB1257 Clerk notification of meth conviction to the TBI.
- •SB1503/HB1397 Failure to alert police when meth is manufactured on property.
- •SB1596/HB1456 Methamphetamine criminal charge-indicate substance involved.
- •SB1751/HB1574 Limits on the purchase of ephedrine and pseudoephedrine <u>from 108 grams to 28.8 grams</u>

Annually

•SB2021/HB1661 Punishment for manufacturing and possessing methamphetamine.
